TARGET PARTICIPANTS AND CORRESPONDING REGISTRATION FEE

PAPER SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

- A one-page abstract not exceeding five hundred (500) words must be submitted, including the title, name and affiliation of the authors, body of the abstract, references, and at least five (5) keywords.
- Papers should be research-based and original, which will be verified by a screening committee who will also review the paper based on the completeness of the required components in the abstract. Originality and ownership of the paper will also be attested by the participant by signing a certificate of originality and authenticity.
- The one-page abstract should contain three (3) paragraphs containing section of introduction, methodology, key results and conclusion.
 - The first paragraph should contain the introduction describing a brief overview of essential background information and objective of the study. Pertinent findings from previous studies that are relevant to the current work should also be included. The research question or objectives, and the highlight of its contribution to the existing knowledge should be cited. Acronyms must be clearly defined, e.g. GPE (Gravitational Potential Energy).
 - The second paragraph should contain a concise description of the methodology, design, or how the study was conducted. It should be in a narrative format and should not include bullets or sequential numbering. Reaction or standard formula like ${}^{236}_{92}U^* \rightarrow {}^{160}_{54}Xe + {}^{36}_{38}Sr + {}^{1}_{0}n + {}^{1}_{0}n$ are allowed.

Mathematical expressions given as follows are allowed provided that symbols are properly defined for instance,

$$V(r,\theta,\phi) = \frac{\alpha + \gamma \cos \phi}{r^2 \sin^2 \theta \sin^2 \phi} + \frac{\beta}{r^2 \cos^2 \theta}$$

where α, β , and γ are parameters, $V(r, \theta, \phi)$ is a noncentral quantum potential.

- The third paragraph should contain results and conclusions. This section of the abstract should include description and discussion of key findings of the study with their interpretation. It addresses the research question(s) and provide a concluding statement that emphasizes the significance of the work.
- It is highly encouraged to include citations to previous work to establish credibility. References are included in the total word count and must follow the provided format. Lastly, figures and tables should not be included in the abstract.

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• A short acknowledgment to supporting entity(ies) may be included as an extra paragraph. Paper abstract should be submitted via online (please check website).


PAPER PRESENTATION GUIDELINES

- It is recommended that presenters will use the ICMRI official PPT template.
- Presenters are given 10 minutes to present their work and 5 minutes for Q&A portion.
- All parallel sessions have assigned moderator to coordinate the session and act as timekeeper.
- Presenters are advised to be in the designated session room 20 minutes ahead of time and submit his/her presentation for technical details.
- If the presenter wishes to present his/her paper using his/her owned laptop, they are advised to bring adaptors.
- The presentation should be saved in pdf format to avoid system compatibility error.
- The use of any audio/video content should be embedded in the presentation. Links to sites are not allowed.
- As back-up, it is recommended to bring an electronic copy of your presentation saved in USB drive.
- No presentations will be archived. All of them will be deleted after the event. Only the authors can provide copies of the presentation upon request from the participants.
- Lastly, all the references should be cited in the presentation.

POSTER PRESENTATION

- The required poster size is 3 feet by 4 feet (36 inches by 48 inches).
- Font sizes: Title: 85pt, Authors: 56pt, Sub-headings: 36pt, Body text: 24pt, and Captions: 18pt
- The poster contains abstract, introduction, methods, results and discussion, conclusion, and acknowledgement.
- Also include the title, author and co-author names, and their affiliation(s).
- Place the corresponding author's e-mail address, phone, and fax numbers in the lower left corner of the poster.
- Do not use a different font style to highlight important points.
- Do not use all UPPER-CASE type in your posters.
- Use the **bold face** or *italics* or combinations to emphasize words and phrases.
- Left-align text. Using fully justified text will create large gaps between some words and make it difficult to read.
- Submit also an e-copy of the poster in pdf format.
